SECURITY TIPS & TECH NOTES

Scams, yes, we've got scams!

Greetings Shipmates! I don't know about you, but does it seem the volume of scam e-mails, scam iMessage/Test messages, and scam phone calls are increasing every day? It sure seems that way.

More recently, banks have started sending out e-mails warning of scams relating to financial services and credit cards. Setting alerts on your bank accounts and credit cards may well save you from an unpleasant situation down the road. I especially like one alert offered by Citibank where they notify you if a transaction posts where the card was not presented. You will get those where you order from an on-line retailer, or pay a utility bill on-line with a credit card. So, take advantage of having your financial institutions watching your accounts, because they stand to lose as well if something happens. Alerts can be set in your profile with your institution(s) to cover not only a specific situation but also dollar amounts that will trigger an alert.

BYLAWS REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT

This is the report of the Branch Bylaws Review Committee. The Committee met laws. at the FRA Low Country Home on Friday, May 23rd, 2025, at 1600 to review the Branch By

In attendance were Branch Parliamentarian PNP Don Muccheck, Chairman; Branch Bylaws Committee Chairman PRPSE Fred Bolz; Branch President-Elect Shipmate Don Barton, Branch Vice President-Elect Shipmate Steve Koch; and Branch Secretary Shipmate Sarah Ihme, Members. Committee Member PNC Laurie Bailey was unavailable but submitted her input.

The Committee reviewed all Articles and Sections of the bylaws with the following corrections and/or amendments reflected as follows:

Article V, Section 501(b), Change the word “then” to reflect “than”. Grammatical error. No further action is required.

The word “then” should be “than” grammatical errors. No further action is required.

Article VII, Section 702(b), Third line from top has the word “polcies” misspelled. It should be “policies.” Typographical error. No further action is required.

Article IX. Section 904. The committee recommends amending this section to reflect “904(a)” and add a new section 904(b) to read as follows:

“Section 904(b). The Board of Directors may expend a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) periodically for the sole purpose of restocking Branch membership pins and medallions as requested by the Branch Secretary. “

Article X, Section 1002. Sixth line from the top has the word “God” misspelled. It should reflect the word “Gold.” Typographical error. No further action is required.

Article X, Section 1006 states: “American Essay Contest Awards shall be in the form of gift cards as awards. There shall be up to six Third Place in the amount of \$75.00, six Second Place in the amount of \$100.00, six First Place in the amount of \$200.00, and one overall winner in the amount of \$500.00”.

Change this section to read as follows:

Section 1006. “American Essay Contest Awards shall be in the form of gift cards as awards. There

shall be up to six Third Place in the amount of \$75.00, six Second Place in the amount of \$100.00, five First Place in the amount of \$200.00 and one overall winner in the amount of \$500.00”.

In the past, the Branch awarded six First Place winners an amount of \$200.00 each, and one overall winner an additional amount of \$500.00, for a total of \$700.00 that the overall winner received. This change reduces the amount of award money dispensed for First Place winners by \$200.00.

Article X, Section 1007. Change the word “the” in the first line to reflect “their.” Typographical error. No further action is required.

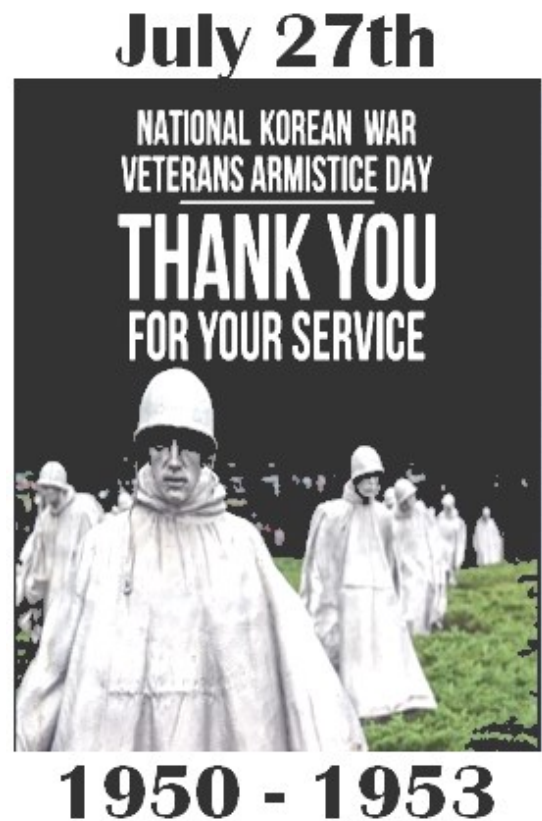
Add a new sentence at the end of Section 1007 to state: “These officer hat pins are the property of Branch 269.”
